20 East 74th Street, 12/14D



As you enter the lower level, you're greeted by an abundance of sunshine from a wall of windows with southern and western light. The living room is gracious and well-proportioned. Off the living room is one of two (2) terraces where you can watch the sunset over Central Park. The gourmet open eat-in kitchen has top-of-theline stainless appliances which include a Sub-Zero refrigerator, Wolf stove, and Bosch dishwasher. White cabinetry, an abundance of storage plus a separate dining space completes this kitchen.

Also on this floor is a large bedroom with an ensuite bath as well a powder room and Miele washer and dryer. The 14th floor has two (2) enormous bedrooms, each with ensuite baths. The primary bedroom has a private terrace and a 9' x 14' walk-in dressing room/closet. The windowed primary bathroom has two sinks and a large shower with multi-jets.
